

## Notes from the Parish Council Meeting

Residents at the meeting voiced their concern about the speeding traffic, through Main Street and up and down the Nuneaton Lane, and now we have also had reports of the same thing happening in Hilary Bevins Close and Station Road as we have stated previously we would like to see a 20 mph speed limit throughout the village with an hope this will help. We talk to the police every opportunity we get about this problem, but they say they do not have resources to monitor our village, or any other village who have similar problems to ours. We can only hope that the new chicane may help in Nuneaton lane. We will be shortly placing a vehicle activated sign probably in Station Road. The parish council would ask all car users who live in the village to make sure they set a good example by keeping within the speed limit at all times.

If anyone is interested in joining a village speed watch team, please get in touch with our parish clerk who will send you all the information you require.

With regards to the land at the rear of Hilary Bevins close which David Wilson Homes said they are prepared to transfer to the village, the parish council are still in the process of evaluating the maintenance costs. We will keep you updated of the progress.

You will all no doubt be aware that the parish council set up a sub-committee to come up with plans to provide new play equipment and where it would be cited within the recreation ground. These proposed plans and layout have now been completed. In the coming weeks there will be chance for all residents to view these plans, at a presentation meeting, and talk with the people there who are presenting them. Please take this opportunity to become involved. Any comments you make will be looked at by the parish council before a final decision is reached.
